Critical Appraisal workshop delivers a comprehensive and practical overview of what is required to understand and appraise clinical papers with confidence.

When a literature search is carried out, finding relevant results is only half the story. Not all published research is of equal value or rigor. In order to practice effective evidence-based healthcare, it is necessary to critically appraise any piece of research that you intend to use. The workshop will include time for group discussion looking critically at a piece of research (paper circulated in advance via email, to be read before the session).

- understand the role of critical appraisal and its place in evidence-based practice
- know the basic components which make up the critical appraisal process
- gain knowledge of the questions that need to be asked of research
- understand the relative importance of these various factors on which judgements are made
- gain some basic skills at interpreting statistics
- become an attentive and critical reader
