Well Wishers helps take the heat off staff

Staff working in hospital and community services across Walsall were given a helping hand during July's heatwave, thanks to the efforts of the Trust's charity.

Well Wishers charity was able to offer staff fruit, drinks and ice creams over the extremely hot period.

At Walsall Manor Hospital, staff were offered a free ice lolly thanks to support from the Trust's catering department throughout the heatwave.

The charity was also supported by Skanska, Darbar Sri Guru Granth Sahib Ji, Morrisons and Asda in providing free water, drinks, fruit, snacks, tissues and wipes.

On Sunday 17 July, a group of volunteers from the Sikh temple in Rollingmill Street kindly set up outside Walsall's Emergency Department to give staff, West Midlands Police and West Midlands Ambulance Service samosas, drinks and fruit.

Colleagues at Walsall community sites were able to get free refreshments from Walsall Palliative Care Centre and Hollybank House and, through their line managers, funds were also made available to keep them refreshed throughout the heatwave.

Georgie Westley, Fundraising Manager, said: "The charity was absolutely delighted to support staff to keep cool by providing them with refreshments during the heatwave.

"As well as the Fundraising Team visiting areas, staff were sent information of where they could get free water and snacks. We also have an air-conditioned rest room – Manor Lounge, where staff get refreshments free of charge and for the whole of the hottest week it was stocking tip tops and extra water."

Charity makes appeal for corporate support

Steps to Work Chief Finance Officer Caroline Hill said: "Steps to Work and Starting Point Recruitment are passionate about social values.

"Starting Point Recruitment donates 100 per cent of its profits each year to Steps to Work to enable it to make a difference in the local community.

"We feel that by partnering with the Well Wishers charity we will have a far greater reach and will help make a difference to the lives of people who are not able to walk through our doors because of their current circumstances."

Across 60 sites supported by 4,700 staff, the Trust provides local general hospital and community services to around 260,000 people in Walsall and the surrounding areas.

Among Well Wishers' many successes are Lolly's Place – a chill-out room for teenage patients on the Children's Ward – a sensory room at the Child Development Centre



used daily by children with long-term conditions and more recently, Blossom Boxes for end of life patients and their families.

Fundraising Manager Georgie Westley said: "We are extremely proud of what we have achieved to date with the support of the community and local businesses and we would love to build on those relationships, create more opportunities for involvement and to make even more of difference to the people we care for, their families and our staff."

Stroke rehab and Goscote Hospice two main focuses for Mayoral fundraising

Support for Goscote Hospice and rehabilitation for stroke patients are the priorities that Walsall's new Mayor would like her fundraising focus to concentrate on this year.

Councillor Rose Martin has picked Walsall Healthcare NHS Trust's Well Wishers to be one of her chosen charities – and she is keen to find out more about the range of services offered to patients in the hospital and community.

Councillor Martin said: "I have had some early discussions with Well Wishers' Fundraising Manager Georgie Westley and we are going to arrange some visits for me as well as some opportunities for staff to come and see me in the Mayor's parlour.

"I am particularly interested in the work the Trust is doing with Walsall stroke patients. Rehabilitation is so vital and valuable to enable stroke survivors to have the best quality of life possible. The staff who work in the Stroke Rehabilitation Unit at Hollybank House and elsewhere in the community are delivering a fantastic service and I do want to find out more about this, as well as meet some of the patients who are benefitting."

"As well as Hollybank House I will be visiting Goscote Hospice to discuss potential areas that my fundraising can support to enhance the patients' experience throughout my year as Mayor".

The Mayor attended Platinum Jubilee celebrations at the hospital recently and served afternoon tea to staff, and she also visited for the NHS Big Tea celebrations that marked the 74th birthday of the NHS.

"I had a wonderful time serving afternoon teas to staff who work so hard for our communities – it was my absolute pleasure to tell them to put their feet up for a change!" added Councillor Martin.
