


What is Mixed Growth?

Mixed growth means that there are different types of bacteria in your urine. This could be a result of contamination (where bacteria not present in your urine is in the sample) on collection. We are unable to identify whether you had a urine infection at the time the sample was taken.



What do I need to do?

If you have mixed growth, you will be informed to provide another sample as soon as possible. This is important to identify any infection and commence treatment. Please see leaflet on "How to do a Mid-Stream Urine Sample".

Why is this important for me and my baby?

In pregnancy, an untreated urine infection puts you at risk of developing a serious infection for you and/or your baby. There is also an increased risk of your baby being born early, also known as a premature birth.
