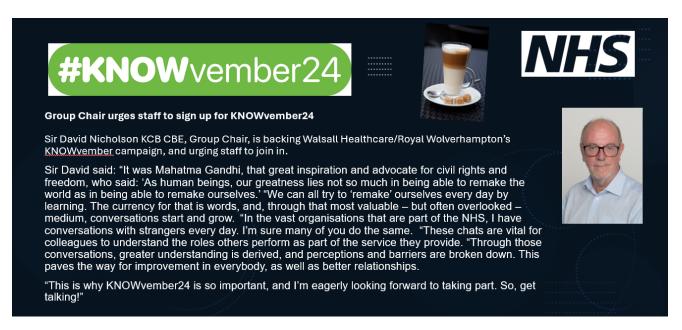


KNOWvember feedback – thank you!



During the month of November (extended until March 2025), the library service showcased the many ways they mobilise evidence and knowledge. One of their popular activities is Knowvember whereby they invited colleagues to sign up to a randomised coffee trial. Giving colleagues an opportunity to meet face/face or virtually; to share best practice, innovation and collaborative opportunities, getting to know what colleagues do, enabling participates to grow their connections.

Sir David Nicholson encouraged colleagues across WHT and RWT to take part.



Benefits of a RCT included:

- Building relationships improving communication, sharing knowledge and ideas.
- Providing time to chat to people about things that aren't directly work related, as well
 as some useful work-related conversations.
- Creating an opportunity to meet people you won't necessarily be directly working with but it's nice to know who they are!
- Encouraging links and collaboration within the organisation.



How did it work?

Following our promotional efforts, we received interest from a diverse range of 110
participants, 86% of whom confirmed meeting with their assigned partner, included
clinicians, directors, managers, allied health professionals, nurses, administrative
staff and students.

- Colleagues were randomly matched and advised to meet for around 20-30 minutes in a place that suited them.
- Colleagues were issued with a conversation prompt sheet (use of this was optional).
- Colleagues were also encouraged to provide their feedback via X #WALRCT24 or email.

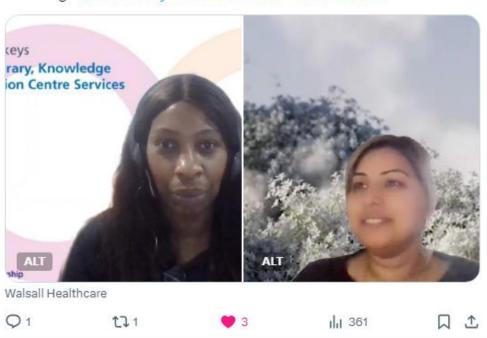
